7.1 Request for Approval to Place Proposition on Ballot at the Annual Meeting on May 15, 2018 Approving Purchase of Vehicles

BE IT RESOLVED that the following proposition be placed on the ballot at the Annual Meeting of the qualified voters of the New Paltz Central School District, to be conducted on May 15, 2018:

Shall the Board of Education of the New Paltz Central School District, Ulster County, New York, be authorized to purchase three 65-passenger or larger school buses at a cost of \$100,000 each, for a maximum estimated cost of \$300,000; and three

Minutes - Workshop Meeting March 14, 2018 30-passenger vehicles at a cost of \$60,000 each, for a maximum estimated cost of \$180,000; for an aggregate maximum estimated cost of \$480,000; and that the sum of \$480,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be raised by the levy of a tax upon the taxable property of said School District and collected in annual installments, as provided by Section 416 of the Education Law, and, in anticipation of such tax, obligations of the District shall be issued.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the School District Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to publish this proposition in the Legal Notice of Annual Meeting, Election and Vote in the designated newspapers.

Following discussion by the members of the Board regarding the bus proposition, the members agreed that the resolution to approve placing the bus proposition on the ballot at the Annual Meeting not be approved at this time but be added to the agenda for further discussion at the March 21, 2018 Community Budget Forum.
