Did You Know ? From the Nurse

Mumps is a highly contagious viral illness. Continue good hand washing, not sharing drinks, and avoiding direct contact with the saliva of an infected person. The most common symptoms of mumps are discomfort in the salivary glands, especially in the jaw area, which may become swollen and tender. Some may have difficulty talking, eating, chewing, or having fever, headache, muscle aches, tiredness and loss of appetite. The symptoms of mumps may resemble other conditions or medical problems.
