PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENT



Starting Wednesday November 6th, African American people all over the country received targeted, anonymous text messages of a racist character. Additionally, Monday this week, another group of text messages went out around the country to Hispanic people and members of the LGBTQ, community. The African American messages contained threats of forced relocation and enslavement, while the messages to Hispanic people and members of the LGBTQ community threatened deportation and forced re-education.

This kind of harassment has caught the attention of police agencies across the country and even the FBI, as Hate Speech is a crime, especially when disseminated across state lines. Unfortunately, some of our own students here at New Paltz High School were targeted by these messages. As administrators and teachers here, we are appalled by the nature of these threats, we reject the intent behind them. All students here at New Paltz should feel welcome and safe, that is a critical part of the work that we are doing here.

We are standing together representing our community values, on behalf of parents, students, teachers, administrators, and support staff. If at any time, as students you feel harassed or distressed by any kind of message of this sort, please know that there are adults here in the building that are here for you, and that this community is endeavoring to live up to our stated values.



PUERTO RICAN/HISPANIC YOUTH LEADERSHIP INSTITUTE

New Paltz High School teacher Rod Castro joined seniors Luis Martínez, Sandra Rodríguez, and Javier Mercado-Núñez at Rockland Community College for the fourth session of the Puerto Rican/Hispanic Youth Leadership Institute.

Our students, alongside peers from 13 school districts, explored two bills currently under consideration by the NYS Assembly: Bill A04424: Addressing false or misleading advertisements of food and food products. Bill A05634: Concerning compensation for positions requiring foreign language skills. Through this program, students are learning how bills become laws while developing critical leadership and advocacy skills by debating the pros and cons of each proposal. With 112 students participating, this initiative is shaping tomorrow's changemakers!



FOOD AND NUTRITION

Over the past few days, Food and Nutrition students participated in King Arthur Baking Company's Bake for Good program. This outreach program gives students the opportunity to learn the math and science of bread baking, bake at school, and share as an act of kindness.
