The Girls and Boys track and field teams had a busy and successful week.

Last Thursday, they competed in a cold and rainy MHAL championship meet. Individual winners were Sean Marz in the 100 dash, Ayden Armstead in the 400 dash, Rhiana Thomas. In the shot put, Livi Lathrop in the triple jump, and Annika Walsh in the 100 hurdles, high jump and long jump.

Yesterday the teams competed in the section championship meet at Rondout Valley. Individual winners were Annika in the high jump, Rhiana in the shot put, Ayden in the 400, and Sean in the 100 and 200.

In addition, there were several other exciting performances. Ady Laurie took second place in pole vault with a state superstandard jump of 11-0. Dylan Friedman took second in the 3000 and 1500 running personal records and meeting the at large standard for the state meet in the 3000, Annika took second in the 100 hurdles with a state at large standard and new school record of 15.71, Alaura Sheeley took second in high jump with a personal best of 5-0. Livi Lathrop finished second in the long jump and third in triple jump. Several students set personal records as well in an exciting evening of competition.


